What is the LUCKY CHANGEMAKER grant for?

- Projects in which art is a catalyst for social change and that showcase how art's social dimension can address cultural responsiveness and responsibility.
- Projects that feature artists who engage socially underprivileged community members who would normally not have access to culture as equal partners.
- All disciplines are eligible if they are engaged with physicality, movement and performance (including dance, visual arts, literary arts, theatre, film/video, music, performance-based arts, interdisciplinary/ hybrid arts).
- We value the process as much as the product. Relationship building is a key goal and projects do not have to automatically result in a physical artwork or a performance.
 Workshops, training, studio practice are eligible, if they directly relate to achieving outcomes of a community-based project.

LUCKY TRIMMER is on the hunt for daring socially engaged artistic projects that embody the LUCKY spirit!

Are you an independent artist or a collective who demonstrates artistic excellence and uses their practice as an innovative conduit for a social cause? Does your project incorporate physicality, movement or performance in an effort to create meaningful change in your community, city, country or the world at large? We might be looking for you...

How can art connect local communities and social minorities? How can artists encourage under resourced communities to overcome barriers, to participate in creative process and create equitable access to culture? How can artists or art organisations create conversations and social change through art? How can we increase environmental awareness or promote social equality through the arts? These are the questions we pose to you!

What is the LUCKY CHANGEMAKER grant?

The winning LUCKY
 CHANGEMAKER will receive a
 cash grant of 500 € to support
 the continuation or realization of
 his/her project as well as
 promotion support via our
 website & social media
 throughout the launch and the
 development of the initiative.

Who can apply?

- Any individual artists or collectives, regardless of their geographic location.
- Artists addressing critical social issues of our times. There are social situations in the world that are deeply affecting people. Our goal is to use art that is engaged emotionally and intellectually to inspire anyone to be agents of change.
- LUCKY TRIMMER acknowledges that there is a growing and vibrant community of artists in our own backyard and we have a particular interest in strengthening our local socially engaged artists here in Berlin.



Realisation of the project

The project must be implemented in 2017. The recipient of the LUCKY grant is asked to send us a report by the end of the year with accounts on how the grant has been used or on how it has been beneficial to the realization of the project. The recipient of the LUCKY grant will also be invited to present his/her project at the symposium LUCKY SUMMIT #9 in Berlin in 2018 (organized in the frame of the LUCKY TRIMMER Tanz Performance Serie #26)
